

## About NCCP iCAYA 2026

7-month knowledge exchange program (Mar to Sep 2026) for **Ministry-designated teams** engaged in **childhood cancer control integration & implementation**

- Hosted by St. Jude Global since 2022, engaging **70** Ministry-designated teams from 39 countries across all **6 WHO regions** with representatives from ministries, multidisciplinary clinical teams, civil society & lived experience experts and advocates, many of whom work primarily outside of the childhood cancer sphere
- Explores **real-world scenarios** in national **programs, policy and legislation**, and considerations to integrate WHO Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer **CureAll** pillars and enablers at the country level
- Live & post-session recommendations & resources guided by evidence, frameworks, and practice

### What is the **approach** of the program?

- 6 sessions (each 80 minutes) with selected country teams Mar-Aug 2026, with open Capstone Sep 2026 (90 minutes)
- Sessions mainly in English with simultaneous translation in UN languages French/Spanish/Russian as indicated
- Monthly guided team reflection exercises alongside tools to apply systems thinking to improve collective outcomes

### What do teams stand to **benefit** from participating in the program?

- Join a select global cohort, contributing to frameworks to integrate children, adolescents and young adults in national cancer control planning, implementation and monitoring
- Establish/strengthen networks with cancer control experts within one's country as well as with other country teams
- Exchange insights with other teams on options to strengthen efforts to achieve WHO Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer targets
- Co-develop recommendations & resources that may be contextualized by country teams for national policy and programme planning, implementation and monitoring while strengthening learning and health systems
- Earn certificate of completion (country team & individual)
- Access cohort-specific Community of Practice materials and opportunities, with all resources provided cost-free

### How can **new teams** participate in the program?

- Form a **Participant** Country team with 3-8 members, submit initial **Individual Application**. Candidates meeting eligibility are contacted and invited to coordinate a Country team submission (one Ministry support letter + Statement of Collaboration)

### How can **NCCP iCAYA graduates** participate in the program?

- Form **Participant** Country team with primarily new members, committing to full program & Capstone
- Form **Mentor** Country team with 2/+ members who completed NCCP iCAYA, committing to 3/+ sessions & Capstone
- Apply **individually** to be a member of the NCCP iCAYA Regional Expert Group


### What are the **CureAll** pillars and enablers that are discussed in the program?



By 2030, achieve at least a 60% survival rate for children with cancer globally, and reduce suffering for all, via:

- **Pillar 1:** Centers of Excellence and Care Networks with sufficient competent workforce
- **Pillar 2:** Universal Health Coverage with benefit packages and organizational models for quality services
- **Pillar 3:** Regimens for Management with context-appropriate guidance, essential technologies & medicines
- **Pillar 4:** Evaluation and Monitoring with quality assurance and information systems
- **Enablers:** Advocacy, Leveraged Financing, and Linked Policies and Governance
